I love autumn! I've always marked the passing of another year with falling leaves. It's the way I reset my internal clock. I take a walk in the woods with my camera on a couple of peak-color days. I like to look up through the underside of the leaves when they are backlit with sunlight. Above me and below me is saturated with color. It feels like the whole world is transformed for a moment.

When I enter the Portage Faith sanctuary in the daylight, I always feel my eyes drawn to the stained glass. The rich and radiant colors capture my attention as they seep in from the corners of the room and above the altar. I never get tired of studying the images and the color variations produced by light passing through colored glass.

In the fourth century, almost 1800 years ago, St Basil used the metaphor of light passing through translucent objects to describe the effect of God's Spirit on those who live by faith in Jesus Christ.

"Just as when a sunbeam falls on bright and transparent bodies, they themselves become brilliant too, and shed forth a fresh brightness from themselves; so souls wherein the Spirit dwells, illuminated by the Spirit, themselves become spiritual, and send forth their grace to others." Come Holy Spirit and shine through us. Make us radiant with God's steadfast love like autumn leaves or stained glass. Backlit by the Spirit's light may we transform the world around us with the beautiful colors of God's mercy and compassion. May others be drawn to the light that streams through us and fills us with joy.
