⁴When a large crowd was gathering, as people were coming to him from town after town, he said in a parable: ⁵ "A sower went out to sow his seed, and as he sowed some fell on a path and was trampled on, and the birds of the air ate it up. ⁶ Some fell on rock, and as it grew up it withered for lack of moisture. ⁷ Some fell among thorns, and the thorns grew with it and choked it. ⁸ Some fell into good soil, and when it grew it produced a hundredfold." As he said this, he called out, "If you have ears to hear, then hear!" (Luke 8:4-8, NRSV)

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

I have a nemesis and her name is Thistle. Thistle and I first became well-acquainted when I moved to this verdant corner of the world twenty-one years ago. She is rather prickly, and we never took much of a liking to one another. Whenever she would show up, poking her head up out of the dirt in my flower beds, I would pull her out and send her packing. Thistle is nothing if not persistent, though. Soon she began bringing along all her friends when she arrived for a visit. I call them Thistle-squatters. They manage to find any space that I have freshly dug and cleared of all weeds and made fertile for my intended plantings and then POW. There they all are making themselves at home, as plentiful as if I had planted them all there on purpose. They make themselves at home, burrowing deep into the fertile soil and growing tall in the briefest of days crowding my beautiful perennials and trying (sometimes successfully) to choke them to death.

Thistle and I have been fighting a pitched battle in my front flowerbed for about three years now. Currently, I think I am winning the latest battle against her, but I am afraid I could easily lose the war. You see, weeds like Thistle never give up. Her kind are plentiful and tenacious. They have the strength of millennia of wildness on their side. Thistle is a survivor. As such, she observes no boundaries, plays no favorites, and takes no prisoners. She is a robust opportunist. When offered a choice between competing with the other weeds and the lawnmower over a sunny spot in the crowded lawn or a prime space of cleared warm earth next to my coneflowers, rosebushes, and silver mound in the flowerbed, Thistle will choose the flowerbed every single time. It's a no-brainer for her and a headache for me. I have to be alert to her advances at all times else she overrun the whole darn thing.

I am ashamed to say that Thistle nearly achieved her dream of conquering my flowerbed this week. I can't really say that her advance was a sudden one. The opening salvo began when I was on vacation a few weeks ago. She and a few of her close friends found a foothold on the far side of the bed over by the edge of our lawn. It was a sneak attack that I barely noticed in the bustle of getting back home and getting into the swing of non-vacation life again. It's not that I didn't know she was there. I did know. But I figured I had time to get out there and send her packing without too much fuss— in a day or so. But one day turned into two, two days turned into a week, and a week turned into three. Suddenly, when I walked out there to tackle her, I couldn't see my precious perennials for the sea of Thistle and friends everywhere.

Needless to say, I was nearly overwhelmed by the carnage. Coneflowers drooped and black-eyed Susans withered. Rose bushes had buds rotting on the stem and lavender clumps were straining for sunlight. This was all my fault. I had let down my guard, and Thistle had taken over when my attention was focused elsewhere.

What was I to do but dive in and start digging and pulling frantically? I even pulled and dug in the rain. I have labored and sweated to return the soil in my flowerbed to its pre-Thistle condition but progress is very slow. Unfortunately, other opportunists such as Crabgrass, Ground Ivy, Foxtail, Nutsedge, Purselane, and Water Knotweed took advantage of their spiky protection and squatted along with Thistle and friends. So, I have to ruthlessly evict them, too.

I will keep at it until my flowerbed is rid of all occupants I did not plant there. However, I know that the battle is never-ending. The gardener can never stop evicting the weeds if she wants the intended flora to thrive. One can have the richest soil in the world, but it is as attractive to the invasive weeds as it is necessary to the hybrid vegetation, we hope will grow in it. Keeping secure what is pure and beautiful takes constant protection, vigilance, and work. There is never a time we can let down our guard and stop chasing out the creeping opportunists like Thistle.

I would like to say I have learned my lesson. However, distractions abound and other life battles sometimes draw my attention away from my war with Thistle. She's not going anywhere, but neither am I.

I pray that you all have a wonderful end to your summer and a brilliant start to your fall. I'm looking forward to sharing it all with you.

LUCKY LASAGNA DRIVE THRU DINNER


