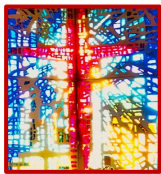

I spent Thursday, August 21, at the Portage County Fair. I timed my visit to see Portage Faith Church youth participate in the Junior Fair. Harper Thiel competed in western style walk and trot with her horse "Red". Nathan, Tom, Matt, and Sam Wright (Lynn and Sharon Wright's grandchildren) were in the arena showing their lambs. I saw Olivia and Abbey Pfost cheer on their Wright cousins after their own competition with chickens had ended. Jensyn Shaulis had just finished "showmanship" competition with her steer. She introduced me to her two steers in their stalls.

It was inspiring to watch the youth competition. Each contestant had invested months of hard work in their 4-H project. There were high moments and moments of frustration. A first timer who took home a ribbon beamed with joy. A young girl whose steer decided to act more like a bucking bronco had a bad night. Some competitors had noisy "melt downs" outside the ring, their broken expectations flowing in tears. Living through these lows and highs develops resilient character with the help of encouraging families and leaders. Kids were learning how to handle disappointment. Take what you've learned and build on it for next year.

Like all character-building youth programs, the big word in 4-H is "relationship." Trustworthy relationships with peers and caring adults shape youth into responsible and compassionate adults. "Working together to build sustainable community change" is what 4-H is all about.

I was positively impressed at the fair. Hats off to our youth and their families and the 4-H leaders who support them. All of the youth did a great job! Whether or not they brought home a ribbon they deserve our congratulations!

As a church, our focus is also on relationships. Whenever we baptize a child, we renew our own commitment to support our church with our prayers, presence, gifts and service. We promise to care for every child and adult that we baptize. It takes a whole lifetime of caring relationships for us to fully live into God's grace. It is through trustworthy relationships with people and through the ups and downs of experience that our relationship with a loving and merciful God grows.

Pastor Bill invites you to participate in a six-week **Bible Study** on the Gospel of Mark, **Tuesdays, from 11:30 am-12:30 pm, September 16-November 4.** (We will not meet on Tuesday, October 21).

Mark is widely believed to be the first written Gospel in the New Testament. Matthew and Luke both borrow much of their material from Mark. Mark has no birth story and no appearance of the risen Jesus after Easter morning (in the original version of Mark). At sixteen chapters long, it's the briefest Gospel. Mark is the primary Gospel in the lectionary for the year 2026. Now is a great time to prepare ourselves to receive the good news according to Mark. You'll receive a student book, and our class will include video presentations by Professor AJ Levine. Together let's expand our understanding of Mark's unique way of sharing the story of Jesus.
